For fans of the hit FX series *Sons of Anarchy*, the acronym SAMCRO is as central to the story as the roar of a Harley engine. When viewers ask, "In Sons of Anarchy who is Sam Crow?", they are actually inquiring about the very heart of the show: the Sons of Anarchy Motorcycle Club, Redwood Original charter. The "Redwood Original" designation signifies that this is the founding and mother charter of the Sons of Anarchy club. While other charters exist in cities like Belfast, Indian Hills, and Nomads, SAMCRO is the original and, in many ways, the most powerful. The club was founded after World War II by a group of veterans, including John "JT" Teller, the father of protagonist Jackson "Jax" Teller. The name "Sons of Anarchy" itself reflects the founders' disillusionment with mainstream society and their commitment to living by their own rules, bound by brotherhood rather than government law.

SAMCRO AS THE CENTRAL CHARTER

- **Prospects:** The lowest rank, consisting of men seeking full membership. They perform menial tasks and must prove their loyalty. Half-Sack Epps and later Rat Boy are notable prospects.
- **Hangaround and Old Ladies:** Associates and partners of members, respectively, who exist on the periphery of the club's inner sanctum.

This hierarchy creates a military-style command structure that allows SAMCRO to operate efficiently in both legitimate and criminal endeavors.

KEY MEMBERS OF SAMCRO

When fans ask "In Sons of Anarchy who is Sam Crow?", they are often thinking of the core group of men who wear the SAMCRO patch. These characters drive the plot and embody the club's values and conflicts.

Jackson "Jax" Teller

Jax is the protagonist and moral compass of the series. He begins as the Vice President and eventually becomes President. His journey is defined by his desire to reform the club and steer it away from the violent and drug-fueled path set by his stepfather, Clay Morrow. Jax is deeply influenced by the writings of his biological father, John Teller, and his struggle between loyalty to the club and his own conscience is the central conflict of the show.

Clay Morrow

Clay is the original President of SAMCRO for the first few seasons. He is a ruthless, calculating leader who believes in preserving the club's power and wealth, often through violent means. His relationship with Jax is complex and fraught with tension, as Clay is both a father figure and an antagonist. Clay's actions, including his involvement in the death of John Teller, create deep-seated rifts within the club.

Bobby "Elvis" Munson

Bobby is the club's Secretary and one of its most loyal and emotional members. Known for his love of music and his kind heart, he often serves as a voice of reason and conscience within SAMCRO. His death in the later seasons is a devastating blow to Jax and the club.

Filip "Chibs" Telford

Chibs is the Road Captain and a Scottish ex-pat with a dark past. He is fiercely loyal to Jax and serves as a trusted advisor and enforcer. His signature Glasgow smile (a scar on his face) is a reminder of his violent history with the Irish mob. Chibs eventually becomes Vice President and, later, President after Jax's death.

Alex "Tig" Trager

Tig is the Sergeant at Arms and perhaps the most volatile and unpredictable member of SAMCRO. He is intensely loyal to Clay and later to Jax, but his impulsive nature often leads to catastrophic consequences. Despite his violent tendencies, Tig also shows vulnerability, especially in his relationships with his daughters and later with Venus Van Dam.

Wayne Unser

While not a patched member, Wayne Unser is a close ally of SAMCRO. He is the former Chief of Police for Charming and suffers from cancer. His deep ties to the club, especially to Gemma Teller, make him a critical ally in their criminal operations. Unser often acts as a bridge between the club and law enforcement.

Gemma Teller Morrow

Gemma is not a member of SAMCRO in the official sense, but she is arguably

one of the most powerful figures associated with the club. As the wife of John Teller, then Clay Morrow, and mother of Jax Teller, she exerts immense influence over the club's decisions. Gemma is the matriarch of SAMCRO, and her actions often determine the course of the narrative.

THE CULTURE AND VALUES OF SAMCRO

SAMCRO is more than just a criminal organization; it is a brotherhood with a distinct set of values and traditions. The club's motto is "One percenter," a term derived from the American Motorcyclist Association's claim that 99% of motorcyclists are law-abiding, leaving 1% as outlaws. SAMCRO embraces this outlaw identity, viewing themselves as outside the law but bound by a strict moral code of their own.

Brotherhood Above All

The most sacred value within SAMCRO is loyalty to the club and to fellow members. This bond is considered stronger than family, marriage, or personal ambition. Betrayal is the ultimate sin and is punished with extreme prejudice. The club's bylaws govern everything from how to handle disputes to the consequences of breaking the code.

Legitimate Business Fronts

To maintain a facade of legitimacy, SAMCRO operates an auto repair shop called "Teller-Morrow Automotive" (later

"Teller Auto"). This business serves as the club's headquarters and a front for their illegal activities, including gun running, drug dealing, and money laundering. The shop is a central location in the show and a symbol of the club's dual existence.

Gun Running and Criminal Enterprise

SAMCRO's primary criminal enterprise is the illegal arms trade. They smuggle and sell weapons, often from the Irish mob. This operation puts them in conflict with rival gangs, law enforcement, and federal agencies, including the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF). The pursuit of profit and power through violence is a constant theme, and Jax's desire to legalize the club's operations is a recurring plotline.

SAMCRO IN RELATION TO OTHER CHARTERS

The Sons of Anarchy is not a single club but a network of charters across the United States and even internationally. SAMCRO, as the Redwood Original, holds a special status as the mother charter. Other notable charters include:

- **SAMBEL:** The Belfast charter, which plays a significant role in the club's history and in the Irish storyline.
- **SAMINDI:** The Indian Hills charter, which becomes a rival to SAMCRO after internal conflicts.
- **SAMTAZ:** The Tucson charter, which is involved in various conflicts throughout the series.

- **Nomads:** A charter without a permanent home base, consisting of members who travel and support other charters as needed.

The relationship between SAMCRO and other charters is governed by a set of national bylaws and a president's council. Disputes between charters can lead to violent conflicts, as seen with the SAMCRO-SAMINDI feud.

THE SYMBOLISM OF THE SAMCRO PATCH

The SAMCRO patch is a powerful symbol of identity and belonging. It features a grim reaper holding a scythe and an ankh, with the words "Sons of Anarchy" and "SAMCRO" stitched on the back of the leather cut (vest). Each element of the patch carries meaning:

- **The Grim Reaper:** Represents death and the club's willingness to confront it. The scythe signifies the club's power to take life.
- **The Ankh:** An ancient Egyptian symbol of eternal life, suggesting that the club and its bond transcend death.
- **The SAMCRO Lettering:** Identifies the specific charter, grounding the universal symbol of the Sons of Anarchy in the local context of Charming.

Earning the patch is a rite of passage that signifies a man's complete commitment to the club. Losing the patch, or having it taken away, is a fate worse than death for most members.

SAMCRO'S ROLE IN THE STORYLINE

The entire narrative of *Sons of Anarchy* revolves around SAMCRO and its internal

and external conflicts. The show's seven seasons explore themes of loyalty, betrayal, family, and the struggle for redemption. Jax Teller's journey is a direct reflection of the tensions within SAMCRO: the pull between the old ways of violence and the possibility of a better, more legitimate future.

The club's interactions with other criminal organizations, including the Mayans, the Chinese Triads, the Irish mob, and the Aryan Brotherhood, form the basis of the show's action and drama. In addition, the constant pressure from law enforcement, particularly the ATF and later the San Joaquin County Sheriff's Department, creates a cat-and-mouse dynamic that keeps the club on the defensive.

Internal power struggles, particularly the rivalry between Jax and Clay, and later the fallout from the deaths of key

characters, drive the emotional core of the series. SAMCRO is not just a setting; it is a character in its own right, with its own personality, history, and destiny.
