

Before You Begin: Review the Concepts

Take a few minutes to read through the day's activity and its corresponding answers before sitting down with your child. This preparation allows you to anticipate tricky spots and plan how you will explain a concept if your child struggles. For instance, if the activity involves sorting words by vowel team, knowing the correct categories in advance helps you guide the conversation.
